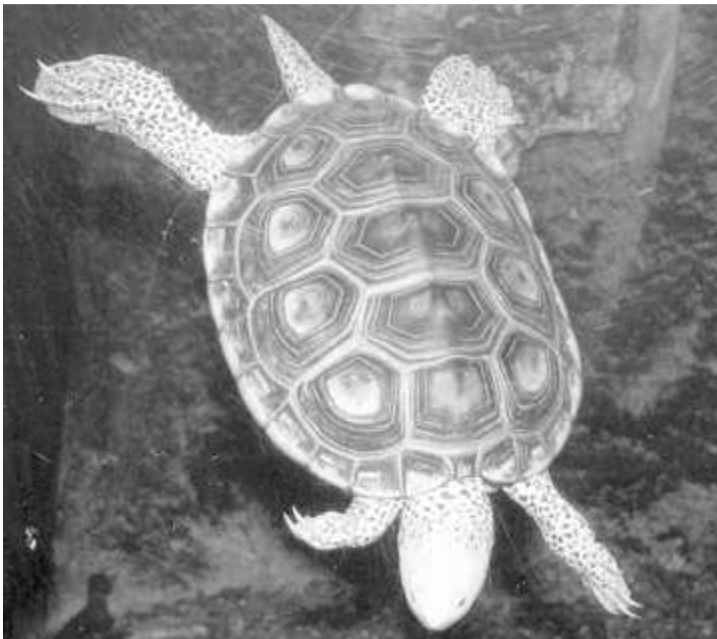


docks (with OCRM permitting approval) serving parcel 12B with flexibility for placement per Exhibit 16.2. The Key Location Ordinance shall be amended by the Town to accommodate same as and when the dock(s) are ready to be Developed by Property Owner. [Ed. Note: The Key Location Ordinance maps every dock that has and will be permitted on the Island.]

“As indicated in the enclosure, there can be no more than two docks on the mile-long bank along the Kiawah River on this TMS parcel. Dock master plans are for instances where a multiplicity of docks could possibly be sought. That is not the case here.”

Walker “emphasizes” through his letter that KDP will conform to regulations in the proposed development and writes several times about “OCRM’s ongoing strategy of twisting the plain meaning of OCRM’s guidelines and regulations to include consideration of the impacts of future development that cannot proceed without separate permitting approval appears to be for the sole purpose of delay and to make any future development on Captain Sam’s Spit impossible.”

DHEC-OCRM has not made a decision on this request.
